Recipe Corner

Pueblo Blue Bread (Frying Pan Bread)

- | | |
|--|---|
| 1 1/2 cups flour | 1/4 cup chopped sweet green pepper |
| 1 1/2 cups blue cornmeal (yellow may be substituted) | 1/4 cup chopped onion |
| 6 teaspoons baking powder | 6 tablespoons shortening or cooking oil |
| 1 teaspoon salt | 4 teaspoons chili powder |
| 1/4 cup sugar | 1 1/2 cups milk |
| 6 tablespoons grated cheese | 2 eggs, slightly beaten |

1. Sift dry ingredients, except chili powder in large bowl.
2. Add green pepper, onion and cheese.
3. In heavy skillet, melt shortening or heat cooking oil and mix in chili powder.
4. Cool chili oil and add to milk and eggs in separate bowl and mix well.
5. Stir mixture into dry ingredients until well blended.
6. Return to skillet and bake in 400 degree oven for 35 minutes.
7. Cut in wedges and serve hot.

The Puebloan People once lived in the areas now known as Arizona, Colorado and New Mexico. Today Pueblo People are primarily located in New Mexico. The 19 Pueblos (Indian villages) of New Mexico include: Acoma, Cochiti, Isleta, Jemez, Laguna, Nambe, Ohkay Owingeh, Picuris, Pojoaque, Sandia, San Felipe, San Ildefonso, Santa Ana, Santa Clara, Santo Domingo, Taos, Tesuque, Zia, and Zuni. The Hopi call Arizona home and the Ysleta del Sur Puebloans are in Texas.

In honor of Native American Heritage Month, we would like to highlight 3 Native Americans that we consider notable Native leaders:

JOHN B. HERRINGTON (Chickasaw): was born in Oklahoma in 1958. John is a retired Navy Commander and test pilot. He has logged more than 3800 flight hours in over 30 types of aircraft! John is also America's first Native NASA astronaut and was a crewmember of space shuttle Endeavor in 2002. John organized and participated in Rocketrek: A 4,000 mile bike ride from Washington State to Florida. The trek began in 2008 to encourage students in the fields of science, math, engineering and technology. His trek took him through many Indian reservations.

Shoni & Jude Schimmel (Confederated Tribes of Umatilla): were born on the reservation in Mission, Oregon. Big sister Shoni was born on May 4, 1992 and Jude was born on November 22, 1993. Shoni started playing basketball when she was 4 years old and Jude at 5. They both grew up loving basketball and playing family pickup with mom, dad, and their brother. The family decided to move from the reservation so they could have more opportunities. First the family moved to Hermiston and then to Portland. Shoni played varsity basketball in high school for 4 years. Jude played 3 years of high school basketball and also lettered in softball and cross country. Both girls are now star players for the Louisville Cardinals and both play the position of guard. Jude is in her junior year at the University of Louisville and her major is sociology.
