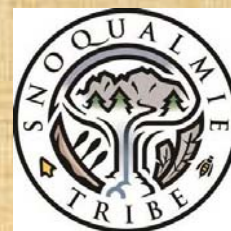

Recipe Corner

QUINOA BERRY YOGURT PARFAITS

Quinoa (pronounced KEEN-wa) is a grain crop which is native to South America's Andean region and has been cultivated for about 5,000 years. Source: American Indian Health & Diet Project: www.aihd.ku.edu

Ingredients:

1 cup quinoa, well washed 16 oz. bag frozen mixed berries
2 cups water 2 cups vanilla flavored yogurt



Directions:

Place quinoa in a strainer with fine mesh. Wash well. Bring water to boil in a 1 quart saucepan. Stir in the quinoa and turn down temperature until just barely boiling. Cover and simmer until all the water is absorbed (15-20minutes). After 15 minutes begin to watch the quinoa closely, stirring occasionally and replacing the cover. When the water is all absorbed, remove from heat. Set aside to cool. Refrigerator to chill before combining ingredients for the dessert.

To prepare dessert: Place 1/2 cup chilled quinoa in a small cup or bowl. Over the top of the quinoa, spoon 1/4 cup vanilla flavored yogurt, and then 1/4 cup of the berries. Serve immediately. Makes 8—1 cup servings. Source: www.chehalistribe.org/newsletter/archives/2015-03/
