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Recipe Corner: 3 Sisters Soup

This is a traditional Native recipe from the Iroquois Nation. The 3 sisters: maize (corn), squash & beans were the 3 main crops of some Tribes. The sisters were grown together because they helped one another to grow. Older sister corn offers beans support. Giving sister beans pulls nitrogen from the air and adds it to the soil for all to share. Beans also hugs them together by growing through sister squash's vines and growing up corn's stalks. Sister squash's big leaves keeps the soil cool and keeps weeds from growing. When combined, the 3 sisters are a nutritional powerhouse!

Ingredients:

- ◆ 2 cups canned white or yellow hominy, drained
- ◆ 2 cups fresh green beans, trimmed and snapped
- ◆ 2 cups peeled and cubed butternut squash
- ◆ 1 1/2 cups diced peeled potatoes
- ◆ 5 cups water
- ◆ 1 1/2 tablespoons chicken bouillon granules
- ◆ 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- ◆ 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- ◆ 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions: Place the hominy, green beans, squash, and potatoes into a pot, and pour in water and chicken bouillon. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low, and simmer until vegetables are soft, about 10 minutes. Blend flour into the butter, then stir into the soup. Increase heat to medium, and cook for 5 more minutes, or until soup thickens. Season with pepper, and serve. Makes 6 servings.

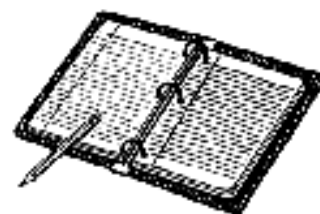
